

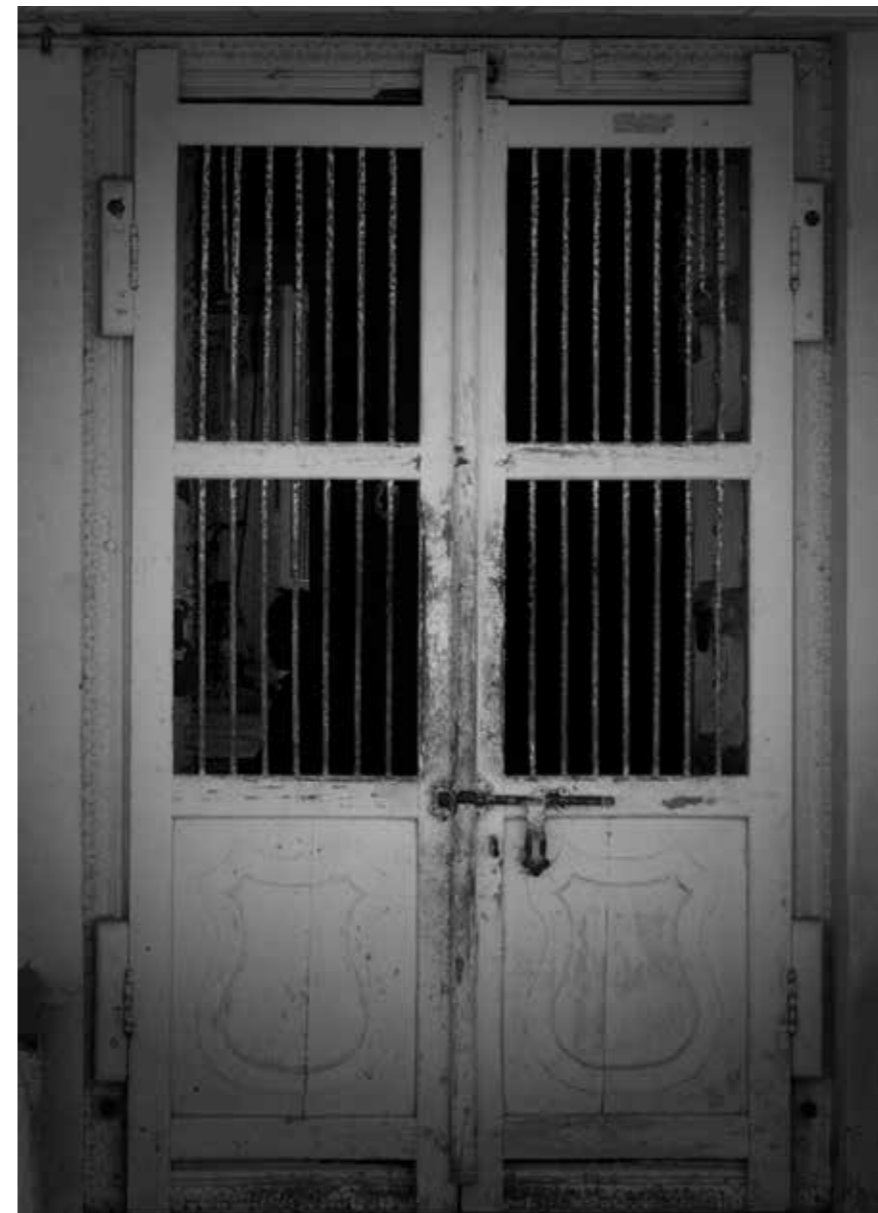

In existence since 2013, the Navneet Foundation has played a leadership role in the fields of healthcare, disaster relief, affordable housing, education, tribal welfare, and other areas of public service. Going a step beyond donations and charity, programs at the Foundation are built around reducing the carbon footprint, helping downtrodden communities, and creating affordable housing for the needy through the construction of schools, rehabilitation centres, hospitals, and animal shelters.



THE YEAR THAT WAS

The Navneet Foundation dedicatedly follows the philanthropic principles of Gandhiji – for there is no better experience than finding oneself in the happiness of others.

2016-17 was an important year in the history of India. From Olympic sports and space missions to women's rights and environmental conservation, the year that was came marked with extraordinary achievements made by Indians in every field. While demonitisation of the Indian currency and the recent passing of the Goods and Services Tax bill brought many a hardship across income groups, these revolutionary reforms came packaged with a hope for a better India.

Startling revelations by Oxfam highlight that 57 Indian billionaires have the same wealth as that

of the bottom 70% of the country's population. One of the causes behind this increasing rise of income inequality is the lack of accessibility to good health and education – thus, helping the rich stay rich and the poor stay poor. When families have more mouths than they can feed in the hope that more hands can earn more, they fail to account for the price of health and education that would enable them to rise above the vicious daily wage cycle. Education ensures better paying jobs and helps entire families break free from poverty. However, not many are able to reach higher grades or even afford education above Grade 10.

Navneet Foundation has been working in healthcare and education since its inception. Having laid its' founding stone in 2013, the Foundation invests in social change beyond the needs of the society. Today, Navneet continues to support pioneering initiatives in healthcare, education, disaster relief, animal welfare, and tribal welfare.



PROMOTING HEALTHCARE

Over several years, the Navneet Foundation, through the establishment of hospitals in Maharashtra and Gujarat has taken the responsibility of helping patients. In this section, we bring you a glimpse of our initiatives that also reflects our commitment towards promoting healthcare among the downtrodden.

NAVNEET HI-TECH

Borivali, Mumbai

In the last 18 years since its inception, Navneet Hi-Tech has been the provider of affordable medical services. Since 1991, over 20 lakh patients have availed of OPD services, and 33,000 patients have benefitted from inpatient and OT services through daily operations and various other camps and activities.

HIRA MONGI NAVNEET HOSPITAL

Mulund, Mumbai

The Pragati Foundation, a charitable Institute that began 50 years ago by a group of students, had one homeopathy dispensary and a small 30-bed hospital called Naresh Manilal Gandhi Sarvajanic Hospital. Today, it is Hira Mongi Navneet Hospital - a 120-bed multispecialty hospital that caters to patients in need.

NAVNEET JAIN HEALTH CENTRE

Dadar, Mumbai

The Navneet Jain Health Centre at Dadar, Mumbai provides OPD and diagnostic facilities. This health centre also provides hundreds of tests, including but not limited to blood tests, X-rays, and sonographies at highly subsidised costs.

NAVNEET DIALYSIS CENTRE

Borivali, Mumbai

The Navneet Dialysis Centre at Borivali, Mumbai currently houses 67 dialysis machines. Dialysis treatment done at this centre are provided at a subsidised cost. On an average, about 500 patients reap the benefits of these dialysis machines every week.

NAVNEET MEDICAL CENTRE

Ahmedabad

The Navneet Medical Centre at Ahmedabad is a multispecialty healthcare centre that provides OPD and diagnostic facilities. A wide range of tests are offered to patients in need at affordable rates.

NAVNEET CANCER RESEARCH HOSPICE AND DIALYSIS CENTRE

Mandvi, Gujarat

Navneet Cancer Research Hospice and Dialysis Centre was established in 1993 as Jankalyan Medical Society. Founded to attack and detect cancer and other crucial diseases in all forms, the main objective of the centre is to investigate the incidence, prevalence, symptoms pathology, treatment, and promotion of the cure for cancer.

NAVNEET HEART FOUNDATION

Navneet Foundation has partnered with the Lions Club of Bombay, King's Circle to provide relief to deserving patients who do not have adequate resources for undergoing a heart surgery. The Navneet Heart Foundation provides consultation to patients and their families suffering from heart-related diseases. Through appropriate guidance and care, the work done by Navneet Heart Foundation has resulted in more than 30% reduction of patient cardiac care.

Navneet Foundation also provides financial support to patients who do not have resources for undertaking expensive surgeries.

MEDICAL CENTRES, CAMPS & SETUPS

MEDICAL CAMPS

Navneet Foundation has established Tribal Medical Camps in five tribal villages of Khanivade Panchayat, Maharashtra. Although Khanivade is geographically only 50 kms from Mumbai, the tribal residents of villages of Khanivade live an underprivileged life – one that lacks basic facilities such as motorable roads and medical services.

The Foundation reaches out to residents of Khanivade by sending a doctor on home visits. From Monday to Friday, one doctor and a physician assistant (PA) visit a village a day. Every patient is checked and a medical file capturing basic details such as weight, height, and medical condition is created. Details of every visit and medical condition are maintained in the file. First aid and medicines are provided free of cost to every patient who drops by for a consultation.

Thus, the Tribal Medical Camp setup succeeds in making medical aid accessible and increasing general awareness towards health and hygiene practices.

PEDIATRIC SURGERY CAMP

Shree Bidada Sarvodaya Trust is a charitable non-profit organisation committed to render medical and surgical treatment to patients of all ages, caste, and race. The trust is well known for the pediatric medical camp it organises every year in Bidada, Kutch, India. At the camp, over 12,000 patients from over 100 villages drop by for a checkup.

The objective of the pediatric surgery camp is to diagnose and treat ailments in children from remote villages. In Kutch, since villages are very remote, it takes time, effort, and money to transport a sick person to a hospital. Camps such as these enable villagers to pool their resources and get a complete checkup conducted during specific times of the year. The pediatric camp is generally held during the month of February.

WOMEN CAMPS

Navneet Foundation in partnership with Shree Bhojay Sarvodaya Trust Hospital undertakes health camps for women. These camps are conducted in various villages. Gynecologists from across India conduct small surgeries and treat minor ailments during these camps. Since health issues of women generally take a back seat in rural areas, these camps are also a means to provide medical awareness about critical issues such as personal hygiene, and cancer prevention and detection.

Bhojay Sarvodaya Trust was incorporated in 1996 with a motto to provide basic medical facilities to people of rural Kutch, especially those residing in remote areas.



OTHER ASSOCIATIONS

Navneet Foundation has a long-standing association with Shri K.V.O. Jain Manav Seva Kendra, Mumbai, Shree Bidada Sarvodaya Trust Hospital, Kutch, and Shree Bhojay Sarvodaya Trust Hospital, Kutch. Joining hands with hospitals to help contribute towards the upgradation of diagnostic and medical equipment, these partnerships have been instrumental in promoting preventive healthcare.

MONETARY SUPPORT

The Navneet Foundation is associated with KEM Hospital, JJ Hospital, Sion Hospital, and Manav Kalyan Kendra, Mumbai. These hospitals initiate requests for financial help to needy patients, which are honoured by Navneet Foundation. So as to ensure funds are appropriately utilised for each patient, the Navneet Foundation directly provides financial aid to the concerned hospital.

PROMOTING EDUCATION

“No child in India shall be deprived of quality education.”

Working towards this vision, the Navneet Foundation has initiated many activities in the area of educational programs. From strengthening language and math skills and helping students learn in a play-way method to distributing books to vulnerable students of Std. X in the drought-affected Marathwada region of Maharashtra, the Navneet Foundation has taken many small steps towards making quality education a right of every child in India.

TEACHER’S TRAINING WORKSHOPS

Teachers are the backbone of any educational system. They need to constantly reinvent their skillset to ensure that educational outcomes are achieved. Education Policy and National Curriculum Framework (NCF 2005) has recommended activity-based, child-centred learning. From 2016-17, board examination language papers for Std. X will be in the revised format of ‘activity sheet’ or Krutipatrika.

Considering this scenario, Navneet Foundation collected responses from teaching communities across India through a systematic need assessment. Responses from teachers indicated that training in “workshop” mode needed to be a prerequisite to equip teachers with necessary competencies. Based on the collected responses, Navneet Foundation decided to strengthen the efforts of the education department and thereafter, initiated the Krutipatrika Training Workshop for teachers.

Krutipatrika Training Workshop

Navneet Foundation setup a team and created a training workshop designed to acquaint teachers with the significance of activity-based teaching-learning. This initiative enabled teachers to understand the

concept of activity-based evaluation i.e. Krutipatrika (language) – a methodology that was introduced in Std. IX and X. Teachers could now develop skills to design Krutipatrika and assess performance of their students in the prescribed format. The training workshops led to the creation of insight amongst the teaching community about a new evaluation system in the making. It also created opportunities for resources to conduct such trainings in their respective regions. So far, Navneet Foundation has created a bank of over 50 resources to conduct Krutipatrika workshops across Maharashtra.

REMEDIAL EDUCATION

Excellence in academics has been the guiding principle for educational endeavors at Navneet Foundation. During a survey, the Foundation came across a government school in Waliv, Maharashtra, where there were a large number of students who were not able to achieve expected educational outcomes. Catering to 350 students from Std. I-VIII, the school’s medium of learning was Marathi but majority of the students came from Hindi speaking states. This created a hindrance in learning.

So as to improve learning outcomes of these students, Navneet Foundation started a remedial education class in one school and appointed three para-teachers. Conducted during regular school hours, the academically weak students were sent to remedial class for two sessions daily. These sessions focused on language (Marathi) and arithmetic skills of the students. Once the students achieved proficiency they were able to rejoin, keep up, and gain more knowledge during the span of their main class.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING

Vocational education provides job-specific technical training that enables young, aspiring students to acquire skills relevant to the requirements of certain trades. Also known as Vocational Education and Training (VET), these programs are made up of courses that are directly aligned to land a job in a chosen profession, thus, enabling students to attain self-employment.

Navneet Foundation along with Matru Vandana – a home for the retired elders, has setup an ITI in Bidada, Kutch, which imparts much needed, job-oriented courses (short-term and long-term) to the rural youth.

STUDENT ASSISTANCE

Navneet Foundation, in partnership with Shree Kutchhi Visha Oswal Sthanakwasi Jain Mahajan and Shree Kutchhi Visha Oswal Seva Samaj supports aspiring students in achieving great heights in their academics with loans, scholarships, and honours for students from Std. XI and above.

Shree KVOS Jain Mahajan is an NGO that oversees the running of several schools and activities for relief to the poor. Shree Kutchhi Visha Oswal Seva Samaj undertakes activities in the field of social, education, medical, personality development, cultural, housing, sports, games, woman empowerment, and upliftment of downtrodden classes of society.

SCHOLARSHIP WITH A DIFFERENCE

Navneet Foundation has been supporting the 100-year old Sheth Dhanji Devshi Kutchhi Visha Oswal Kelavani Fund (DDKF) to identify and groom promising students.

Assisting students for educational excellence, the Sheth Dhanji Devshi Kutchhi Visha Oswal Kelavani Fund created a structure that provides scholarships and loans, repays the loans, helps families settle into their villages, and generally benefits the community on the whole.

Scholarships are given to select students to pursue higher studies. Support is provided at every level - from exam preparations and selection of institutes to visa processing. The Fund in partnership with Navneet Foundation does its best to ensure that students make the best out of the given opportunity to pursue a great education and build a bright future.

OTHER INITIATIVES

With a long-standing history of philanthropy, the Navneet Foundation takes social responsibility seriously. Over the past few years, the Foundation has been actively involved in building the social infrastructure of the country. As in previous years, this year too, the Foundation continues to work towards preventive healthcare, the green revolution, reducing inequalities faced by socially and economically backward groups, and in promoting the welfare of animals and tribals.

NAVNEET CHHAS KENDRA

There is a high prevalence of Vitamin A Deficiency (VAD) in the rural population of Kutch. Economic constraints, sociocultural limitations, insufficient dietary intake, and poor absorption leading to depleted vitamin A stores in the body have been regarded as potential determinants of the prevalence of VAD.¹

Taking this into consideration, Navneet Foundation began Navneet Chhas Kendra 33 years ago - an initiative that provides many a family in rural areas their daily dose of buttermilk nutrition, resulting in a noticeable reduction in night blindness caused by vitamin A deficiency.

Every day at 5.45am, the gates of Navneet House at Rayan, Kutch open to welcome people from all castes and communities for their daily quota of buttermilk. As a result of this intervention, vision-related defects of people have noticeably reduced. Systematic records are maintained with respect to the requirements of each family and appropriate quota of buttermilk is accordingly distributed. Care is taken to ensure that the buttermilk is made from the best quality of milk powder, as fresh milk is scarce in the desert region.

ANIMAL WELFARE

Navneet Foundation recognises the right of existence of every animal on this planet. Although domestic animals are essential for the survival of humans, they are the first ones to be abandoned in times of drought.

Animal shelters such as Panjrapole and Gaushalas come to their rescue, providing shelter, food, and water. When the tough times recede, the owners return to claim their animals. The existence of such shelters ensures that the poor do not have to bear the financial burden of purchasing fresh livestock. It also ensures that the animals are not abandoned and left to die.



TRIBAL WELFARE

Navneet Foundation supports the activities of Tribal Integrated Development and Education Trust (TIDE), a project under the care of Bhansali Trust. Tribal welfare projects include specific programs in the field of healthcare, education, income generation and micro-credit, de-addiction, and the preservation of indigenous faith and culture.

The Tribal Integrated Development and Education Trust was formed in 2003 to work for the upliftment of poor and needy tribals. Today, there are over 100 million tribals from 537 different tribes and sub-tribes living in approximately 1,35,000 villages in India.

A VILLAGE FOR CHILDREN

Navneet Foundation supports 10 children at SOS Children's Village in Bhuj. These are orphaned children with nowhere to go. The Village has taken them under their wing and looks after their all-round development, which includes education, nutrition, health, and psychological needs until they settle down in their respective lives.

This year, the Foundation went a step ahead and helped convert 20 conventional streetlights in the SOS Children's Village campus in Alibaug to solar LED lights. 7 new streetlights were also added to the campus. Today, the Children's Village is illuminated all through the night - creating a bright and safe environment for growing children.

CARE FOR THE ENVIRONMENT

Navneet Foundation supports Shree Vivekanand Research Training Institute (VRTI) for rainwater harvesting and watershed development. VRTI is credited with bringing about the green revolution in Kutch through its pioneering work in watershed development. This year, VRTI took up desilting of check dams and other water bodies that were constructed many years ago.

Shree Vivekanand Research Training Institute is headquartered in Mandvi, Kutch. Established in 1975, VRTI's main objective is to promote sustainable rural development with community participation for creating drinking water resources and distribution systems.
